## SUBJECT: UNIT RISTORY

The unit was constituted 7 March 1960 in the regular army as the 68th Aviation Company. The Company was activated 14 April 1960 at Fort Ord; California and inactivated 6 December 1962 at Fort Crd. The unit was reactivated 15 August 1964 in the Facific and operated in Viotzem as the First Dtility Tactical Transport Helicopter Company in the history of army aviation. On 1 March 1965 the company was inactivated and designated the 197th Aviation Company. On 5 July 1965 at Fort Benning, Georgia, the 68th Aviation Company (Airmobile)(Light) was activated by verbal order of the Commanding Owners, Third United States Army. Third Army General Order Stumber 200, dated 12 July 1965, confirmed the activation under TOE 1-77E and attached the unit to the 10th Aviation Oroup, Fort Benning, Georgia.

Hajor Joe D. Ecrette assumed ecomend of the company by Unit Order Number 1, dated 12 July 1965, for the intrin period of time until the arrival of all the officers assigned to the company. All the officers were assigned to Seventh United States Army in Cornery at time of activation of the company. On 1 September 1965, the reporting date of all the officers at Fort Benning, Major Weldon F. Honeycutt assumed sommand of the 68th Aviation Company (Airmobile)(Light) by Unit Order Rumber 11.

The company was given thirty days to organise, train, and prepair for overseas movement. During this thirty day time period, the non-consistence officers and enlisted men who were assigned to the occupany joined the unit. By 1 October 1965 the unit and equipment were ready for everseas movement, although there was a shortage of several key enlisted mon.

The 68th Aviation Company main body departed Fort Benning, & November 1965, traveling by bus to Atlants, Georgia, from Atlanta to San Francisco, California, by air and from San Francisco to Yung Tan, Viet Ram abourd the USMS Geiger arriving on 28 Hovember 1965.

The advanced party arrived 10 Hovember 1965 by air and the rear detachment arrived 20 November 1965 by air. The 68th was assigned to the 145th Aviation Battalion.

The first combat mission was flown by the following members of the 68th Aviation Company on 4 December 1965: Major Hammysutt, Major Le Master, Major Shelby, Major Williams, Captain Richards, Captain Rughes and Captain Rethmeter. This mission was flown with the 118th Aviation Company and A Company, 501st during the orientation phase of improcessing to the Viet Hem operations.

## SUBJECT: UNIT HISTORY (CONT)

The unit became ecombat operational on 10 December 1965 and assigned single dual ship missions until 16 December 1965. On 16 December 1965 the first complete unit type combat assault missions were flown. The first eperation consisted of 12 troop emprishs aircraft and 5 armed a/e and was led by Major Weldon F. Honeyoutt, the Unit Commander. During the day 6 extraction flights and 7 assault flights were completed. Although all aircraft returned safely, three ships were hit and one pilet, Captain Learence H. Sutliff, was wounded. This was the second casuality resolved by personnal of the 68th since arriving in the theatre. Captain David L. Starkey was wounded on a mission with A Company, 501st during the orientation training prior to the unit becoming operational.

On the 16th of December mission, the 68th provided airmobility to extrast 420 members of the 101st ABM. Div. (1/327 and 2/502) from 10 kilometers Wort Northwest of Ben Cet to a landing some 7 kilometers East in 6 lifts. In the afternoon the 68th moved 90 members of the Vistamese 52nd Ranger Ba. from Ba Ria Airstrip to an LE 9 kilometers North in a combet assault.

During the period 17 December 1965 thre 31 December 1965 the 68th Aviation Company performed three company size combat operations, both assemble and extractions as a single company. A total of 15 lifts were made with 1996 treepo being moved. On one of the missions, 5 treep carrier aircraft were attached to the 68th from the 196th Aviation Company. In addition the 66th participated in two battalion tips combat missions during this same period of time.

During the month of December, the 68th Aviation Company flow numerous direct combat support missions. From the time the company become operational, 10 December 1965, and 31 December 1965, the average time flows per assigned aviator was approximately 56 hours.
